Position Role

The role of the position is to provide a comprehensive, collaborative and high-quality physiotherapy service within the Children's Health Services team. The service will be integrated with other Children's Health Services and child, youth and family focussed services across Bendigo Community Health Services (BCHS) to best support vulnerable children and their families.

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Position Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the position are:

- Provide child and family-centred assessment, diagnosis, treatment and management for BCHS' physiotherapy clients within scope of practice.
- Provide paediatric physiotherapy services to infants, children, youths and families, under the Community Health program, Home and Community Care Program for Younger People (HACC-PYP) program, National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) and other funding programs and initiatives as required.
- Undertake clinic-based and home or school-visit based work (where required).
- Facilitate the referral to and liaison with a range of services required to provide comprehensive and collaborative services for children and their families.
- Ensure that all clinical activity undertaken fulfils or exceeds the competency standards of the profession.
- Ensure information is managed in line with organisational, allied health and occupational therapy standards, including the use of BCHS' electronic client management systems.
- Recording of statistical data and documentation requirements within required timeframes.
- Participation in BCHS' continuous quality improvement activities and implementation of evidence-based practice.
- Participation in the review and evaluation of programs as appropriate.
- Participate in the monitoring and review of the demand for BCHS' physiotherapy service to ensure services remain accessible and equitable.
- Participate in internal case coordination and conferencing as a member of a multi-disciplinary team (where required).
- Complete administrative and coordination functions as required, to assist team processes, and optimise outcomes for children and families.
- Attendance at staff/team meetings and program planning as required.
- Maintain and develop clinical and professional skills through continuing professional development.
- This position will have some Key Performance Indicators (KPI's).
- Other duties as directed.

Additional responsibilities for a Grade 2 Physiotherapist position:

- Take a lead clinical role when required, demonstrating knowledge and depth of experience appropriate for designated workload.
- Assist in providing supervision and support to peers and students.

The Role of the Team

The Children's Health Services team includes Paediatricians, Paediatric Registrars, and other Allied Health professionals who work collaboratively to benefit vulnerable families. Many of the families present with complex issues that require holistic responses to enhance the outcomes for the child.

The primary focus of the Children's Health Services team is to provide comprehensive, specialist and allied health and wellbeing services to children and their families. The team provides coordinated and holistic care and referral pathways internally and externally across a range of multidisciplinary services.

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Key Selection Criteria

Essential

1. A Bachelor of Physiotherapy (equivalent or higher) and current registration with the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA).
2. Demonstrated experience, and passion for working in a community setting with children, youth and families with complex needs.
3. Demonstrated experience and comprehensive assessment and practice skills in the area of paediatric physiotherapy.
4. Excellent interpersonal and communication skills (written and verbal) and the ability to engage with vulnerable families, and other service providers.
5. Personal commitment to promoting equality, diversity and human rights in all aspects of service delivery and work within the BCHS Code of Conduct framework.
6. Demonstrated experience in working as a member of a multidisciplinary team.
7. Working knowledge of the Children, Youth and Families 2005 Act and how this may impact on services provided.
8. Demonstrated ability to confidentially maintain accurate records in accordance with BCHS privacy and confidentiality procedures.
9. A current Driver's Licence.
10. A current Working with Children Check.

Desirable

1. Demonstrated experience in supervising undergraduate students and/or peers.
2. Intermediate to high level skills in Microsoft Office programs.
3. Evidence of previous ongoing professional development activity with a focus on children and families.
4. Experience in working with electronic client information management systems.

Probationary Period

Employment with BCHS is conditional on satisfactorily completing a probationary period of six (6) months from date of commencement. During this period your performance will be reviewed with your Manager and, assuming this is mutually satisfactory, your employment will be confirmed at the end of this period.

Staff Review and Development (SRD)

Each BCHS staff member is required to participate in the annual SRD process. The SRD will be based on the Position Role and Responsibilities and Key Selection Criteria in addition to the relevant Branch and Team Plans and the following Performance Indicators.

- Show evidence of your ability to work co-operatively within a team to achieve team goals.
- Establish and develop as key functions of relationship management, regular and professional communication with all your relevant colleagues.
- Demonstrate alignment and integration of practice according to BCHS' Vision, Values, and Strategic Directions.

Administration and Documentation:

Through the use of BCHS processes ensure that all administration and documentation requirements are initiated and completed in a professional and timely manner.

- Show evidence that the administrative tasks of your position are completed in an orderly, timely and accessible manner.
- Demonstrate that your documentation is completed in an accurate, legally and ethically compliant standard, and is produced to an appropriate professional standard.

Demonstrated knowledge and application of the capabilities required for this position including knowledge and understanding of appropriate equipment, legislation, policies and procedures.

- Show evidence of knowledge and understanding of BCHS Strategic Directions and the ability to link key strategic directions to individual and team work plans and individual self-development.
- Demonstrate initiative and enterprise skills that contribute to innovative outcomes.
- Display an appropriate level of awareness of the implications for BCHS of decisions and situations that involve you and others.

Position Performance:

Demonstrate achievement of negotiated performance indicators specific to your position.

- Provide service delivery and income generation under the Community Health program, HACC-PYP program, NDIS and other funding programs and initiatives as required.
- Demonstrate positive outcomes for clients and stakeholders through service provision for a minimum of five to six per day (initial and review appointments).
- Demonstrate an ability to work as a collaborative member of a multi-disciplinary team.

Diversity and Culture:

BCHS treats all people with respect; values diverse perspectives; participates in diversity training opportunities and provides a supportive work environment.

Child Safety:
