The Role of the Team

The Infant, Child and Family Health and Wellbeing Hub team will improve access to integrated and community- based multidisciplinary services for children aged 0-11 years who are experiencing developmental, emotional, relational, and behavioural challenges, and their families. The hub will provide a central point for connecting and navigating accessing health and social care, whilst providing a coordinated and holistic care pathway for children and their families

This exciting new role gives clinicians the opportunity to be a part of a new and innovative team with the opportunity for career development and progression

Position Role

This position provides an opportunity for a suitably qualified and experienced person to work with children and their families to assist the child and their families to reach their full potential using a multi-disciplinary approach and case coordination.

The Occupational therapist will work in collaboration with a multi-disciplinary team including Paediatricians, GP,s, Nurses Speech Pathologists, Psychiatrist family services and Mental Health Services providing assessment and management providing early intervention for children and their families.

Position Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the position are:

- Work independently and collaboratively to provide child and family-centred assessments, diagnosis, treatment and management for hub consumers within scope of practice
- Work within the hub team to plan and implement programs;
- Screen and identify further assessment and referral needs of children;
- Consult with other professionals to enhance outcomes for children;
- Practice in a family-centred and collaborative manner to ensure service responses that are integrated and directed toward clients concerns and diagnosis
- Ensure recording of statistical data and documentation requirements within required timeframes:
- Participate in internal case coordination and conferencing as a member of a multidisciplinary team;
- Ensure information is managed in line with organisational, allied health and occupational therapy standards, including the use of electronic client management systems
- Participate in the supervision of undergraduate occupational therapy students and students of other disciplines where appropriate
- Facilitate a positive team culture that reflects BCHS' values and supports effective communication and resolution of conflicts;
- Participate in continuous quality improvement activities;
- Participate as in the development of hub policies, procedures and processes that impact on the service and on the achievement of relevant accreditation standards;
- Maintain and develop professional skills, in addition to monitoring new developments through continuing professional development;
- Participate in the monitoring and review of the demand for hub services to ensure services remain accessible and equitable;
- · Other duties as directed.



Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. Tertiary qualification in Occupational Therapy.
- 2. Current general registration with Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency.
- 3. Demonstrated record of practice knowledge, skills and experience in working with children and families and significant successful experience as a practitioner.
- 4. A sound knowledge of the relevant legislation, regulations, standards, and competencies related to the programs National Guidelines Best Practice in Early Childhood Intervention, and Victorian Early Years Learning Framework.
- 5. Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- 6. Competent level IT skills and the use of computers for word processing, email and internet.
- Sound written and verbal communication skills, as demonstrated by preparation of timely, accurate and well-organized documents and understanding of privacy legislation and confidentiality requirements.
- 8. Knowledge of family centred practice.
- 9. Sound knowledge of the protective factors and contributors in relation to health inequality and vulnerability.
- 10. Demonstrated understanding of diversity and inclusiveness as a human rights issue.
- 11. Demonstrated commitment to continuous improvement, learning and innovation.
- 12. Current Working with Children's check.
- 13. Current driver's licence.

Desirable

- 1. Demonstrated experience of practice and experience in working with children with complex developmental needs.
- 2. Experience in working with electronic client management systems.

Probationary Period

Employment with BCHS is conditional on satisfactorily completing a probationary period of six (6) months from date of commencement.
