The Role of the Team

The primary focus of the Alcohol and Drug Services Team is to provide a comprehensive range of specialist treatments and supports to clients of BCHS and lead coordinated care internally and externally across a multidisciplinary network. The team works within a social model of health framework with an emphasis on provision of health promoting information and education with a commitment to equity and access.

The Pharmacotherapy Clinic operates from our Kangaroo Flat site providing a range of community supports relating to assessment, prescribing and dispensing within the opiate replacement therapy (ORT) program. The Pharmacotherapy team comprises the clinic nurse, a Nurse Practitioner and a general practitioner.

Position Role

The position will support the Senior leader – AOD Clinical Services with support of duties in operating as an Orticare addiction specialist health clinician and meeting the requirements of Orticare activities. This role is that of a health clinician educated and authorised to function with a high degree of autonomy and accountability whilst also working collaboratively in a multidisciplinary team. This position is grounded in the health clinician profession's values, knowledge, theories and practice.

This position will engage collaboratively with colleagues within Bendigo Community Health Services (BCHS) and community partners to ensure promotion and support of Pharmacotherapy prescribing. This position will provide clinical leadership and act as a resource for AOD staff, nursing, pharmacist and medical colleagues within the Greater Bendigo region.

Position Responsibilities

The responsibilities of the position are:

- To liaise with Orticare staff as agreed
- To promote pharmacotherapy prescribing to GP practices in the Greater Bendigo Region
- To promote and provide support to access Orticare as a Pharmacotherapy resource
- Provide prescribing support for Pharmacotherapy prescribers
- To promote and provide support for local clinicians (GPs, Nurses, Pharmacists, AOD workers) to access Victorian Opioid Management ECHO sessions
- To promote and provide support for local clinicians to access the RAMPS addiction medicine telehealth consulting service.
- To promote, organise and support local clinical networks (GPs, Nurses, Pharmacists, AOD workers)
- To present a minimum of one case for Project ECHO per six monthly reporting period
- To maintain data of activities of the role.
- Other duties as directed.



Key Selection Criteria

Essential

- 1. A Health Clinician with current registration with the Australian h Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA)
- **2.** Ability to provide vaccination information that meets the requirements for healthcare workers.
- **3.** Demonstrated experience and evidence of advanced clinical knowledge and clinical skills in AOD and Pharmacotherapy clinical practice.
- **4.** Demonstrated knowledge of policy, evidence and practice as it relates to Pharmacotherapy and AOD Services.
- **5.** Strong interpersonal and communication skills demonstrating a capacity to build and maintain relationships with diverse stakeholder groups in achieving collaborative outcomes.
- **6.** Demonstrated highly developed written and verbal communication skills and proven interpersonal and problem-solving skills.
- **7.** Personal Commitment to promoting equality, diversity and human rights in all aspects of service delivery.
- 8. Ability to demonstrate and display the values of Bendigo Community Health Services.
- 9. Current drivers licence.

Desirable

- 1. Experience in change management and quality improvement processes
- 2. Experience in working in an AOD service and or Opiate Replacement Therapy

Probationary Period

Employment with BCHS is conditional on satisfactorily completing a probationary period of six (6) months from date of commencement. During this period your performance will be reviewed with your manager and, assuming this is mutually satisfactory, your employment will be confirmed at the end of this period.
